#### 6. Public Comment

Leslie & Michael, fit 4 life – Leslie is the General Manager and Michael is the Sales Manager of fit 4 life Spring Lake, located at 650 Shell Drive. Leslie stated they relocated about a year ago to a new state-of-the-art facility and offer 24/7 access to all fit 4 life gyms, free group fitness, Kid Zone, and two (2) free personal training sessions. Leslie stated they have a big military community and have a lot of long-time local members at the gym and take pride in that. Leslie stated they offer military and family discounts, and government options, and is working on putting together a corporate wellness program for the Town of Spring Lake employees. Leslie stated they are asking if they could meet with each department to gauge some interest to see if they would be interested, what they are looking for in a gym, and how they can fit their deeds.

Fredricka Sutherland – Mrs. Sutherland stated Happy Birthday to the Town of Spring Lake and wanted to thank Mrs. Renee and the ladies of the Water Department as she came to Town Hall last week to conduct some business and when she walked up, all of them were typing, busy, diligently working hard, and very professional. Mrs. Sutherland stated on the agenda, Ordinance 2023(2), which talks about large vehicles, trailers, and private property, she would like some clarification regarding that ordinance.

#### 7. Presentation

- a. Spring Lake History Jami McLaughlin, Resident Historian Ms. McLaughlin presented facts regarding the Town of Spring Lake. Examples: when first incorporated, when the first railroad was built, how Spring Lake got its name and Main Street. Ms. McLaughlin stated the Town saw the first bank and first parts of Commerce in the 1960s, but the economy prospered in the 1980s and 1990s and a lot of what is on Bragg Blvd and beyond is a result of that. Ms. McLaughlin explained a book that Mr. Howard Pate and herself wrote that was published on November 8, 2004. Ms. McLaughlin stated Mr. Pate was the Town's first Postmaster, was on the Chamber of Commerce that was created in 1962, and was one of the first Board members of the Chamber. Ms. McLaughlin stated a lot of the streets in Spring Lake were named after residents. Ms. Laughlin explained the pictures that are in the book that Mr. Pate and herself wrote.
- b. <u>Air Monitoring and Air Quality Ambassadors Denise Bruce, Air Quality Manager, Sustainable Sandhills</u>
   Ms. Bruce did not attend the meeting.
- c. <u>H.O.P.E. Course Marvin Price, Director, Strategic Community Initiatives</u> Mr. Price presented a PowerPoint explaining the purpose of H.O.P.E., H.O.P.E. courses, credentials, class layout, benefits for students and employees, and work-based learning.

- e. Mayor's Report Mayor Kia Anthony Mayor Anthony stated Happy Birthday to Spring Lake and cake was provided to celebrate. Mayor Anthony stated the Town had a beautiful Pinwheel Planting in support of child abuse awareness, as the Police and Fire Departments, Town Manager, Clerk, and several staff and community members came out and planted the silver and blue pinwheels. Mayor Anthony requested citizens to acknowledge and support the Child Advocacy Center and if time permitted, please volunteer as it is such an important cause to be there for children who have been victims of abuse. Mayor Anthony stated the Town's Police Department volunteers with them and was acknowledged for the work they have put in throughout the year. Mayor Anthony stated this was the first year the Town of Spring Lake was involved in the Pinwheel Planting and plans to continue to do this every year in support of Child Abuse Prevention.

Alderman Lackman stated it is rose growing season and contributed some beautiful roses for the Town of Spring Lake's birthday. Alderwoman Cooper stated Saturday, May 6, 2023, Community Heartbeats is sponsoring a food distribution at Southwinds Plaza starting at 9:00 am.
